Minutes of a Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday, 14th January 2020 at 7.30 p.m. in West Knoyle Village Hall.

Application for: Full Planning
Proposal: Demolition of Barn 2 and erection of 1 no. dwelling and associated works
At: Oxleaze Farm, West Knoyle. BA12 6AE

Members felt that this new-build would look aesthetically more pleasing than the barn conversion proposals and were pleased that the revised plans had addressed their previous concerns relating to the roof ridge height and the glass gable end, which has been revised to more modest patio doors and windows. The Clerk confirmed that the proposed roofing material on the revised plans was slate tiles. RESOLVED to recommend approval of the application. RESOLVED to request that Wiltshire Cllr. Jeans 'call in' this application if it transpires that the planning officer is likely to recommend this application for refusal. Proposal made by the Chairman and carried with a unanimous vote.
